### Procedures for Youth Classes and Camps during the Coronavirus Pandemic to Meet the **Oregon Health Authority Mandates**

1. Parents please keep yourselves and your children home under these conditions as stated by the Oregon Health Authority (OHA)

Remind all staff and parents often to keep themselves and their children home with any illness involving fever, new cough, or shortness of breath. Individuals should stay and remain home for at least 10 days after illness starts and until 72 hours after fever is gone, without use of fever reducing medicine, and COVID-19 symptoms (fever, cough, shortness of breath, and diarrhea) are improving.

2. Visitors to classes will be minimized to limit contact and possible exposure to the virus. Thus, the following procedures will be in place.
3. Parents will remain outside the building for the duration of the class or camp. Please check your student in and out in front of the studio entrance on the corner of Bartlett and 8th streets. Each day at check in, students will be screened for symptoms. Here is the OHA guideline on this

Check for new cough and fever for anyone entering the camp facility/area or working with campers and staff. Individuals with a fever greater than or equal to 100.4° F should not be allowed to enter. COVID-19 does not always present with fever or new cough. Symptoms of COVID-19 include fever and new cough, as well as, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing; fever; chills; muscle pain; sore throat; and new loss of taste or smell. If parent cannot check a camper's temperature, the camp must check the temperature.

If a student develops a new cough, fever, shortness of breath or other COVID-19 symptoms during the camp day he/she/they will be isolated from other campers and a parent will be contacted immediately. The Education Manager will stay with the child while he/she/they are waiting to be picked up. Please follow the OHA protocol as stated above on child's return to camp.

4. Staff working with students will be limited to teacher, RGAC Education Manager and an intern. All staff will be wearing a face covering or face shield during classes.

**Students 5 and older are required to wear face coverings during the camp, unless the student**

- a. Has a medical condition that makes it hard to breathe when wearing a mask, face shield or face covering
  - b. Has a disability that prevents them from wearing a mask, face shield or face covering
5. We will be practicing social distancing. Students will be sitting 6 feet apart and will be assigned the same work station throughout the class or camp. Each student will have their own supplies solely to be used by them.
  6. Students will be advised and encouraged to follow OHA protocols on hygiene and respiratory etiquette as outlined below
    - a. Advise all persons in the camp to wash their hands often (e.g., after using the restroom, before and after meals, after coming inside, after sneezing, blowing the nose, or coughing) with soap and water for at least 20 seconds.
    - b. Cover coughs and sneezes with a tissue or elbow.
    - c. Throw any used tissue away immediately into a garbage receptacle; and clean hands after covering coughs and sneezes, and after throwing away used tissues.
